## 118 pound champ Scott Goodale, Colorado School of Mines on quick lead

"It was nice. I could do a lot smarter wrestling and not take so many chances."

"It's my last collegiate tournament ever and I just wanted to go out there and show everybody what I had. I went out there and took control of every match that I could."

126 pound champ Lee Schickel, Pittsburgh-Johnstown

"I knew all I had to do was tie him and I would win it. I decided to dig down deep. Either way, he wasn't getting away from me or I was getting out."

on sudden death

"I knew I could get out. There is nobody in this nation that can hold me down. No way. I knew if I could take him on the mat I would win it."

#### 134 pound champ Corey Kline, Ashland

on stalling

"I have a style, or move, where I like to run underhooks. A lot of guys block that off but that is my set up. It's common guys will nail me once or twice."

on last seconds

"They called me for it again it was that underhook. I pulled it down and I guess he though I was pulling it down into me, but I was pulling it down to where I could get the foot. He hit me with it (the stalling) but I already had the ankle and I figured well that ties it but I'm getting the takedown anyway."

on championship

"All a surprise to me. I just wanted to come in and do my best. When I got here I thought maybe sixth is what I'd shoot for and it happened. I don't really know how to explain it. It's all the hard work all year."

### 142 pound champ Jerry Best Central Oklahoma

on 3rd championship

"This means a lot to me. This one was a lot harder because in my first match I tore cartalige in my ribs and in the semifinal I tore cartilage in my shoulder. I had to work a lot harder this time."

on opponent

"I figured it would be a lower scoring match because he (Albertelli) is more of a square-stance guy and kind of a defensive wrestler. I didn't even know if I could last through the match because of my shoulder. I couldn't do anything with my right arm."

"The first takedown really built my confidence up. It took my mind off my shoulder"

150 pound champ Shawn Bateman, Central Oklahoma

"Finishing my shots was key and he was hard to finish on. I knew I could get in on him from watching and what other people had said. Finishing was definitely the key and it is always is in college."

on last seconds

"I just wanted to hold on. I knew if I kept my hands locked and kept him from tucking my elbow that I would be all right. I was hoping they would call a stale mate but it all worked out."

#### 158 pound champ Mark Cunningham, Central Oklahoma

on opponent

"Ive wreslted him before, he was in my weight last year and he got seventh and I got second. It was tough, but I knew there couldn't be much difference in a year

"I came out strong for the first period and a half and then I slowed down a little bit. As far as the match as a whole it felt pretty good."

167 pound champ Roy Dillow, Colorado School of Mines

"It feels great. To come through unseeded, come all the way through and beat all the top seeds and win the tournament, it feels great."

"I felt at the start of the tournament that if I wrestled tough I could win it and that's what I did. I was relying on being in great physical shape. I've been training hard all week. I knew if I stayed in the guy's face he would get tired."

### 177 pound champ Scott Shipman, West Liberty State

on overtime

"I knew I could get him. I've wrestled him in overtime before once this year and I just knew by staying solid I could get him somewhere.

"I probably should have been a little more aggressive through the rest of the match. You get a little conservative in the national finals. You don't want to make a mistake."

### 190 pound champ and Outstading Wrestler Chad Lamer, South Dakota State

"It feels great. This was my last year and it went perfect.

"That kid was strong. I couldn't set him up for any takedowns. He got me in a front headlock right away and he backed me a couple times. I just kept thinking since it was my last match and I had to keep going."

"He wasn't in very good shape. I just had to keep a positive mind knowing I could still win."

### Heavyweight champ Tony Kenning, Mankato State

on last second takedown

"He was tired. I had a little bit more energy and maybe a little bit more will. In the end whoever wants it more is going to get it."

Coach of the Year Dan Lewis, Colorado School of Mines "I am shocked. I thought the guys wrestled great. This is quite a prestigious award. I thought we would have a chance to get two all-Americans but I never would have thought we'd have two national champions."

### Pittsburgh-Johnstown head coach Pat Pecora

"This is something we've worked for inch by inch, year by year. This is my 20th year as a head coach so it didn't come overnight. I never thought we would be in a position to win a national title. Im very elated."
