EDMOND, Okla. -- Two-time defending champion Central Oklahoma remained the unanimous No. 1 pick in the NCAA Division II wrestling rankings, according to the first regular-season NCAA II Wrestling Coaches Association Top 20 poll.

The Bronchos, 2-0 in duals and with five individuals ranked in the top two at their respective weights, collected all 12 first-place votes to finish with 240 points in the balloting of coaches from around the nation.

North Dakota State received 226 points and is ranked second, while Nebraska-Omaha is third with 206 points as the top three teams remained the same from the pre-season poll. Pittsburgh-Johnstown moved up from fifth to fourth, while Mankato State advanced from 10th to fifth in the poll.

Closing out the top 10 is Southern Colorado, North Dakota, Adams State (Colo.), Wisconsin-Parkside and Ashland (Ohio). Wisconsin-Parkside made the biggest jump in the rankings, moving from 15th in the pre-season poll to ninth.

UCO has two wrestlers No. 1 in the individual ratings -- defending champions Wes White at 158 pounds and Keith Cunningham at 167 -- while 118 Randy Zellner, 142 Biff Jones and 190 Chad Humphrey are all ranked second.

EDMOND, Okla. -- Two-time defending champion Central Oklahoma remained the unanimous No. 1 pick in the NCAA Division II wrestling rankings, according to the latest regular-season NCAA II Wrestling Coaches Association Top 20 poll.

The Bronchos, 2-0 in duals, collected all 11 first-place votes to finish with 220 points in the balloting of coaches from around the nation.

North Dakota State received 208 points and is ranked second, while Nebraska-Omaha is third with 191 points as the top three teams remained the same from the previous poll. Pittsburgh-Johnstown held steady in the fourth spot, while Southern Colorado moved up a notch into the top five.

Closing out the top 10 is Mankato State (Minn.), Wisconsin-Parkside, Adams State (Colo.), North Dakota, and Ashland (Ohio). Wisconsin-Parkside continues to climb up the rankings, after starting the season being ranked 15th.

BRONCHOS STAY ATOP NCAA II POLL -- Central Oklahoma retained its position atop the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 poll Wednesday as the two-time defending champion Bronchos received all 12 first-place votes.

UCO, 5-2 in duals, finished with 240 points and has been the unanimous No. 1 pick in every poll this season. The Bronchos finished seventh in last weekend's Cliff Keen National Dual Championships in Lincoln, Neb., beating NCAA Division I top 10 teams Michigan and Fresno State in the process.

North Dakota State remained second in the voting of 12 coaches from around the nation, finishing with 226 points. Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.) moved up to third, while Mankato State (Minn.) was fourth and Southern Colorado fifth.

Rounding out the top 10 were North Dakota, Wisconsin-Parkside, Nebraska-Omaha, Adams State (Colo.) and Ashland (Ohio.).

UCO has five wrestlers ranked among the top four individuals at their weight, including No. 1 picks Wes White (158 pounds) and Keith Cunningham (167), both defending champions. Chad Humphrey is ranked second at 190, while Randy Zellner (118) and Brian Melchiori (126) are both rated third.

NDSU is led by No. 1 Brian Kapusta, the defending champion at 118.

UCO STILL NO. 1 IN NCAA II POLL -- Central Oklahoma maintained its No. 1 ranking in the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 poll Wednesday as the two-time defending champion Bronchos received all 12 first-place votes.

UCO, 11-2 in duals and owners of a three-year, 26-match winning streak against NCAA II opponents, finished with 240 points and has been the unanimous No. 1 pick in every poll this season. The Bronchos end the dual season Friday by hosting No. 8-ranked Nebraska-Omaha, the last NCAA II team to defeat UCO (19-12 on Jan. 11, 1991).

The top five teams all stayed the same in the voting of 12 coaches from around the nation. North Dakota State remained second in the poll, as it has all season, and was followed by Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.), Mankato State (Minn.) and Southern Colorado.

Rounding out the top 10 was Ashland (Ohio), North Dakota, Nebraska-Omaha, Adams State (Colo.) and Ferris State (Mich.). Ashland made the biggest jump in the poll, moving from 10th to sixth.

UCO has beaten five teams in the NCAA II top 20 -- No. 5 Southern Colorado, No. 9 Adams State, No. 11 Wisconsin-Parkside, No. 16 South Dakota State and No. 17 Southern Illinois-Edwardsville.

North Dakota State owns wins over six top 20 teams -- No. 4 Mankato State, No. 5 Southern Colorado, No. 7 North Dakota, No. 8 Nebraska-Omaha, No. 15 Northern Colorado and No. 16 South Dakota State.

UCO NO. 1 IN FINAL NCAA II POLL -- Central Oklahoma will be the overwhelming favorite to win its third straight national championship next week as the Bronchos maintained their No. 1 ranking in the final NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 poll Wednesday.

UCO was a unanimous No. 1 pick in voting of coaches from around the nation, gathering all 12 first-place votes and finishing with 240 points. The Bronchos won their fifth straight Midwest Regional title on Feb. 18 and qualified all 10 wrestlers for the 32nd NCAA Division II Wrestling Championships, which will be held March 4-5 in Pueblo, Colo.

North Dakota State remained second in the poll, as it has all season, and was followed by Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.), Mankato State (Minn.) and Adams State (Colo.), which moved up from the ninth spot.

Rounding out the top 10 was Ashland (Ohio), Southern Colorado, Nebraska-Omaha, Wisconsin-Parkside and Nebraska-Kearney.

Central Oklahoma has six wrestlers ranked among the top four at their weight, topped by three No. 1 picks -- Ryan Martin at 134 pounds, Wes White at 158 and Keith Cunningham at 167.

The Bison are led by two wrestlers ranked among the top four, led by Brian Kapusta as the No. 1 pick at 118. Pitt-Johnstown has four individuals in the top four, headed by top-rated Craig Thurber at 177. NDSU and UPJ each have eight national qualifiers, second-most behind UCO.
