UCO STAYS NO. 1 IN MAT POLL: EDMOND, Okla. -- Four-time defending national champion Central Oklahoma is the unanimous No. 1 pick in the first regular-season NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 poll.

The Bronchos received all 10 first-place votes in balloting of coaches from around the nation and finished with 200 points. UCO was also the pre-season No. 1 pick with nine of 10 first-place votes.

North Dakota State edged out North Central Conference rival Nebraska-Omaha by one point for second in the team rankings, followed by Pittsburgh-Johnstown in fourth and South Dakota State in fifth.

Rounding out the top 10 is Northern Colorado, Mankato State (Minn.), Wisconsin-Parkside, Portland State (Ore.) and North Dakota.

UCO has three wrestlers listed No. 1 in the individual rankings -- 118-pounder Keith Kizarr, 142-pounder Jerry Best and 150-pounder Shawn Bateman. Best is the two-time defending champion at 142, while Bateman was second and Kizarr third in last year's national tournament.

NDSU has seven individuals ranked in the top six, topped by No. 2 pick Robert Finneseth at 190. The Mavericks are led by defending champion Ralphael Kizzee, who is the top-ranked 167-pounder, while Pitt-Johnstown has two No. 1 individuals in 126-pounder Lee Schickel and 134-pounder Jeff Bricker.

UCO STAYS NO. 1 IN MAT POLL: EDMOND, Okla. -- Four-time defending national champion Central Oklahoma is the unanimous No. 1 pick in the first regular-season NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 poll.

The Bronchos received all 10 first-place votes in balloting of coaches from around the nation and finished with 200 points. UCO was also the pre-season No. 1 pick with nine of 10 first-place votes.

North Dakota State edged out North Central Conference rival Nebraska-Omaha by one point for second in the team rankings, followed by Pittsburgh-Johnstown in fourth and South Dakota State in fifth.

Rounding out the top 10 is Northern Colorado, Mankato State (Minn.), Wisconsin-Parkside, Portland State (Ore.) and North Dakota.

UCO has three wrestlers listed No. 1 in the individual rankings -- 118-pounder Keith Kizarr, 142-pounder Jerry Best and 150-pounder Shawn Bateman. Best is the two-time defending champion at 142, while Bateman was second and Kizarr third in last year's national tournament.

NDSU has seven individuals ranked in the top six, topped by No. 2 pick Robert Finneseth at 190. The Mavericks are led by defending champion Ralphael Kizzee, who is the top-ranked 167-pounder, while Pitt-Johnstown has two No. 1 individuals in 126-pounder Lee Schickel and 134-pounder Jeff Bricker.

The Bronchos received all nine of the first-place votes that were received in balloting of coaches from around the nation and finished with 180 points. UCO, 3-5 in duals with all five losses to NCAA I teams, has been ranked No. 1 in every NCAA II poll since Jan. 27, 1993.

North Central Conference rivals North Dakota State and Nebraska-Omaha remained 2-3 in the team rankings, followed by Pittsburgh-Johnstown in fourth and Northern Colorado in fifth.

Rounding out the top 10 is South Dakota State, Mankato State (Minn.), Wisconsin-Parkside, West Liberty (W. Va.) and Western State (Colo.). Western State jumped from 15th to 10th in making its first top 10 appearance of the season.

UCO is led by a pair of top-ranked individuals -- two-time national champion Jerry Best at 142 and Shawn Bateman at 150.
