NCAA DIVISION II WRESTLING

TEAM AND INDIVIDUAL RANKINGS

EDMOND, Okla. -- Defending champion Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.) is the pre-season pick to win the NCAA Division II national wrestling championship in 1996-97, according to the first NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 poll of the season.

The Mountain Cats earned their first-ever NCAA II wrestling title last year, snapping Central Oklahoma's four-year reign as national champions by five points. Pittsburgh-Johnstown's No. 1 ranking ends UCO's long hold on the top spot as the

Bronchos had been rated No. 1 in every NCAA II poll since Jan. 27, 1993.

UPJ received nine first-place votes and finished with 197 points, while Central Oklahoma earned the remaining first-place ballot and is second with 188 points. Northern Colorado is third, with Nebraska-Omaha fourth and South Dakota State fifth.

Rounding out the top 10 is West Liberty (W. Va.), San Francisco State, Western

State (Colo.), Ashland (Ohio) and Mankato State (Minn.)

The Mountain Cats have six All-Americans back from last year's championship team and have two individuals ranked No. 1 in the pre-season -- 118-pounder John Strittmatter and 142-pounder Tony Albertelli, both national runners-up last year.

UCO returns four All-Americans, with returning national champions Shawn

Bateman (150) and Mark Cunningham (167) both ranked No. 1.

West Liberty is the only other team with two top-ranked individuals as 177-pounder Scott Shipman and 190-pounder Branden Hinkle are both No. 1.

EDMOND, Okla. -- Defending champion Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.) held onto the No. 1 ranking in the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 poll that was released Wednesday.

The Mountain Cats, the pre-season pick for the top spot after earning their first-ever NCAA II wrestling title last year, received nine first-place votes and

finished with 197 points.

Central Oklaĥoma, which had its four-year reign as national champions ended by UPJ last year, earned the remaining first-place ballot and is second with 190 points. Northern Colorado edged out Nebraska-Omaha by one point for third, while South Dakota State is fifth.

Rounding out the top 10 is West Liberty State (W. Va.), San Francisco State,

Western State (Colo.), Ashland (Ohio) and North Dakota State.

Pittsburgh-Johnstown and Central Oklahoma each have two top-ranked individuals. The Mountain Cats have both 118-pounder John Strittmatter and 142-pounder Tony Albertelli ranked No. 1, while the Bronchos have returning national champions Shawn Bateman (150) and Mark Cunningham (167) each listed No. 1.

The Mountain Cats, the defending national champions who were atop the first two polls this season, received eight first-place votes and finished with 197 points.

Central Oklahoma, which had its four-year reign as national champions ended by UPJ last year, earned one first-place ballot and is second with 191 points. Nebraska-Omaha received the final first-place vote and is third with 169 points, while South Dakota State edged West Liberty State (W. Va.) for fourth, 157-155.

Rounding out the top 10 is Northern Colorado, San Francisco State, Western

State (Colo.), North Dakota State and Adams State (Colo.).

Chadron State (Neb.) made the biggest jump, moving from a 19th-place tie to No. 11, while Southern Illinois-Edwardsville advanced from 17th to 13th in the poll. Two teams, No. 17 Central Missouri State and No. 20 Fort Hays State, cracked the top 20 after receiving votes in the last poll.

EDMOND, Okla. -- Nebraska-Omaha took over the No. 1 ranking in the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 poll that was released Tuesday, moving up from No. 3 to overtake defending national champion and previous No. 1 Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.).

The Mavericks defeated then-No. 2 Central Oklahoma 25-16 in the finals of the NCAA Division II Showdown Duals on Jan. 25 and beat No. 4 South Dakota State 21-16 in a North Central Conference match last week to move into the top spot with four first-place votes and 194 points. UNO and UCO will meet again on Feb. 14 in Omaha, Neb.

The Mountain Cats, who had been No. 1 in every poll this season, received more

first-place votes (six) but had 191 points.

Central Oklahoma, which had its four-year reign as national champions ended by UPJ last year, dropped to third with 180 points. South Dakota State is fourth, with West Liberty State (W.Va.) fifth and San Francisco State sixth.

Rounding out the top 10 is Western State (Colo.), North Dakota State, Chadron

State (Neb.) and Mankato State (Minn.).

Debuting in the top 20 rankings this week were Southern Colorado at No. 17

and North Dakota at No. 20.

EDMOND, Okla. -- Nebraska-Omaha retained the No. 1 ranking in the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 poll that was released Tuesday.

The Mavericks, 11-1 in duals, defeated Central Oklahoma 19-16 last Saturday and received all 10 first-place votes in the balloting to keep their top ranking. UNO is seeking its first national title since 1991.

UCO, national champion four times and runner-up three times since joining NCAA Division II in 1990, moved up from third to second following the loss to UNO.

West Liberty State (W. Va.) advanced from fifth to third, its highest-ever NCAA Division II ranking, after a 22-19 dual win over defending national champion Pittsburgh-Johnstown. The Mountain Cats, who had been No. 1 in the first four polls this season, are fourth and South Dakota State is fifth.

Rounding out the top 10 is San Francisco State, Western State (Colo.), North Dakota State, Chadron State (Neb.) and Northern Colorado.

Debuting in the top 20 rankings this week is Truman State (Mo.) at No. 18.

Pittsburgh-Johnstown and West Liberty State each has two top-ranked individuals. The Mountain Cats are led by 118-pounder John Strittmatter and 142-pounder Tony Albertelli, while the Hilltoppers have 158-pounder Rich Foston and 177-pounder Scott Shipman both rated No. 1.

Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 poll Tuesday.

In a close race that saw five teams get at least one No. 1 vote, SDSU received three first-place votes and finished with 187 points to edge Central Oklahoma for the top spot. The Bronchos, who had their four-year reign as national champions ended last year, were listed first on four ballots and finished with 185 points after capturing the Midwest Regional title last week.

Defending champion Pittsburgh-Johnstown, winners of the East Regional, had one first-place vote and 175 points for third, while West Liberty State was fourth with 174 points after winning the South Regional. Nebraska-Omaha fell from No. 1 to No. 5 after finishing second in the NCC, getting one first-place nod and 170 points.

Rounding out the top 10 was San Francisco State, Western State (Colo.), Northern Colorado, North Dakota State and Fort Hays State (Kan.). The Gators, who

won the West Regional, received the remaining first-place vote.

Fargo, N.D.

Central Oklahoma, Pittsburgh-Johnstown and West Liberty State each qualified eight individuals for the national tournament, while San Francisco State and Western Top-ranked South Dakota State, Nebraska-Omaha, Northern State both have seven. Colorado and North Dakota State all qualified six to Fargo.
