EDMOND, Okla. — Pittsburgh-Johnston (Pa.) is favored to win the 1998-99 NCAA Division II national wrestling championship, according to the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 pre-season poll.

The Mountain Cats, national champions in 1996 and third last year behind North Dakota State and South Dakota State, received five of the 10 first-place votes and finished with 195 points in balloting of coaches from around the country.

Nebraska-Omaha, sixth in last year's national tournament, earned two first-place nods and was second with 186 points while defending champion North Dakota State had the remaining three first-place votes and was third with 181 points.

Four-time national champion Central Oklahoma was fourth and South Dakota State fifth in the pre-season poll, with Southern Colorado, Minnesota State-Mankato, Carson-Newman (Tenn.), Northern Colorado and Augustana (S.D.) rounding out the top 10.
