EDMOND, Okla. — Nebraska-Omaha was the unanimous No. 1 pick in the first NCAA Division II wrestling rankings of the 1999-2000 regular season, according to the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Pre-Season Top 20 poll that was released Wednesday.

The Mavericks, with five All-Americans back from last year's national runner-up team, received all nine first-place votes and finished with 180 points in balloting of coaches from around the country.

Four-time champion Central Oklahoma moved up from third to second in the rankings, with North Dakota State going from fourth to third and South Dakota State falling from second to fourth. Ashland (Ohio) maintained its fifth-place rating from the pre-season poll.

EDMOND, Okla. — Nebraska-Omaha regained the No. 1 ranking in the NCAA Division II wrestling poll, according to the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 rankings that were released Wednesday, Feb. 16.

The Mavericks were No. 1 in the first three polls of the season before falling to third behind North Dakota State and South Dakota State in the last rankings, but UNO defeated both North Central Conference rivals in duals the past two weeks to move back to No. 1.

Nebraska-Omaha received eight of the 10 first-place votes and finished with 196 points in balloting of coaches from around the country. NDSU had one first-place vote and was second with 190 points, while SDSU was third, Central Oklahoma fourth and defending national champion Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.), which received the remaining first-place vote, fifth.

Rounding out the top 10 was Ashland (Ohio), Nebraska-Kearney, Wisconsin-Parkside, St. Cloud State and Fort Hays State (Kan.). Northern Colorado made the biggest move, jumping into the rankings at No. 13 after not being rated in the last poll.

UNO is led by top-ranked 165-pounder Chris Blair and has eight other individuals ranked among the top six at their respective weight.

EDMOND, Okla. — Nebraska-Omaha will be the slight favorite to win the national championship next week as the Mavericks held onto the No. 1 ranking in the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 poll that was released Wednesday, March 1.

UNO, which won its second straight North Central Conference crown last week, earned five first-place votes and finished with 195 points in balloting of coaches from around the country. Central Oklahoma, which captured its 11th consecutive Midwest Regional title on Sunday, had the other five first-place votes and had 194 points.

Nebraska-Omaha and UCO lead all teams with nine qualifiers apiece for the NCAA Division II Wrestling Championships that will be held on March 10-11 in Brookings, S.D.

North Dakota State was third in the voting, followed by South Dakota State and South Regional champion Ashland (Ohio). Rounding out the top 10 was defending national champion and East Regional winner Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.), Central Missouri State, West Regional winner Nebraska-Kearney, Minnesota State-Mankato and Southern Colorado.

Both UNO and UCO have six ranked individuals, with the Mavericks led by No. 1 Chris Blair at 165 and the Bronchos by top-rated Jeremiah Constant at heavyweight. NDSU has the most No. 1-ranked individuals with three -- 133 Kris Nelson, 157 Wayne Mooney and 184 Steve Saxlund.
