## 1999-2000 NCAA II ALL-ACADEMIC WRESTLING TEAM

The 1999-2000 NCAA II All-Academic Wrestling Team consists of 96 student-athletes from thirty-two universities and colleges. Thirty-six members were named to the first team, twenty eight to the second team and thirty two were named as honorable mention. The University of Nebraska at Omaha, Anderson College and Ashland University each placed five on the first or second teams. South Dakota State University, North Dakota State University, Minnesota State University-Mankato and the University of Pittsburgh-Johnstown each had four members on the first or second teams.

Brad Kieffer from Truman State, Wayne Mooney from North Dakota State University and Joe Veres III from Ashland University were each named to the team for the fourth time. Eight student-athletes were named to the team for the third time. They include Scott Antoniak from the University of Nebraska at Omaha, Rafael Calisto from American International University, Jake Holscher from Chadron State College, Matt Johnson from Central Missouri State University, Brad Shefchik from the University of Wisconsin-Parkside, Randy Rager from the University of Minnesota-Morris, Derek Maynard from Gannon University and Brady Wegesin from Ashland University. One member of the All-Academic Wrestling Team has a 4.0 grade point average. He is Aaron Monseau of West Liberty State College a second year student majoring in a pre-medicine program.

In order for a student-athlete to be nominated for the NCAA II All-Academic Wrestling Team, he needed to have a minimum 3.00 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale. He must also be in at least his second full year of school, be a varsity member on his team or a key reserve, demonstrate a degree of skill and have a minimum of two letters of recommendation ( academic advisor and coach ) submitted on his behalf.

Minnesota State University-Mankato recorded the highest team grade point average (GPA) in the seventh annual NCAA II All-Academic Wrestling Team selection and won the Academic National Championship. Minnesota State's GPA is the highest ever recorded. It topped the 3.319 that Colorado School of Mines recorded in 1997-98. Minnesota State is only the fourth school to win this prestigious competition. Other winners have been the University of Wisconsin-Parkside, Truman State University and Colorado School of Mines. The team GPA is calculated by averaging the cumulative grade point averages of ten wrestlers from each team of which eight of those wrestlers must have competed in their team's NCAA II National qualifying tournament.
