EDMOND, Okla. -- Defending national champion North Dakota State took over the No. 1 ranking in the final NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 poll that was released Wednesday, Feb. 28.

The Bison, who captured the North Central Conference title last week in qualifying all 10 individuals for the national tournament, were the unanimous pick after receiving all eight first-place votes and finishing with 160 points in balloting of coaches from around the country.

The 2001 NCAA Division II Wrestling Championships are March 9-10 in Greeley, Colo.

Nebraska-Omaha, which held the top ranking in every regular-season poll this season, fell to second with 149 points after finishing behind NDSU in the NCC tournament. Central Oklahoma remained third with 147 points after winning its 12th consecutive Midwest Regional crown last week and advancing nine wrestlers to the national meet.

South Dakota State was fourth and Minnesota State-Mankato fifth, followed by East Region champion Ashland (Ohio) in sixth. Rounding out the top 10 was Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.), Central Missouri State, West Region winner Southern Colorado and Western State (Colo.).

North Dakota State has seven rated individuals, led by top-ranked 184 Steve Saxlund. Nebraska-Omaha has six wrestlers listed in the top eight, heading by No. 1 Chad Wallace at 197, while Central Oklahoma has one No. 1 individual in 125 Mark Dodgen to lead its five ranked individuals.
