EDMOND, Okla. -- North Dakota State is the pre-season choice to win its third straight national wrestling championship in 2001-02 according to the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 poll.

The pre-season poll was determined using returning points from last year's national tournament.

The Bison of veteran head coach Bucky Maughn, who have captured three of the past four Division II national titles, return 65 points from last year's team that trimmed South Dakota State 98-91.5 for the championship. Leading NDSU are two returning individual champions -- 174-pounder Todd Fuller and heavyweight Nick Severson, who are both No. 1 in the individual preseason rankings.

SDSU is second in the pre-season poll with 58 returning points and have three individuals ranked second at their respective weights in 157 Aaron Veskrna, 165 Tyler Bryant and heavyweight Jon Madsen.

Central Oklahoma is third in the pre-season poll, with Nebraska-Omaha fourth and Ashland (Ohio) fifth. Rounding out the top 10 is Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.), Augustana (S.D.), Western State (Colo.) and three teams tied for ninth -- Adams State (Colo.), Central Missouri State and Minnesota State-Mankato.

EDMOND, Okla. -- North Dakota State remained the No. 1 team in the first regular-season NCAA Division II wrestling rankings of the 2001-02 season on Wednesday, according to the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Top 20 poll.

The defending national champion Bison, who have captured three of the past four Division II national titles, received all eight first-place votes in a ballot of Division II coaches from around the country to finish with 160 points.

South Dakota State remained second in the poll, finishing with 146 points to edge out Central Oklahoma's 144-point total. Nebraska-Omaha was fourth with 139 points and Ashland (Ohio) fifth with 129 points in the balloting.

Rounding out the top 10 is Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.), Western State (Colo.), Central Missouri State, Augustana (S.D.) and Minnesota State-Mankato.

Two-time defending national champion and North Central Conference winner North Dakota State received the other three first-place votes and was a close second with 155 points.

East Regional champion Ashland (Ohio) is third in the poll, with Nebraska-Omaha fourth and West Regional winner Nebraska-Kearney fifth. Rounding out the top 10 is South Dakota State, Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.), Central Missouri State, national tournament host Wisconsin-Parkside and Findlay (Ohio).

The NCAA Division II Wrestling Championships are set for March 8-9 in Kenosha, WI. North Dakota State and Ashland have the most individual qualifiers with 10 apiece, while Central Oklahoma, Nebraska-Omaha and Wisconsin-Parkside all have eight. Central Missouri State, Findlay and Nebraska-Kearney each have seven qualifiers.
