EDMOND, Okla. -- Defending national champion Central Oklahoma and Nebraska-Kearney will enter the 2007-08 NCAA Division II wrestling season as co-No. 1s, according to the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association preseason poll released Tuesday.

The Bronchos captured their seventh Division II title last season by 16 points over the runner-up Antelopes and each team finished with four first-place votes and 155 points in balloting of coaches from around the country to share the No. 1 ranking.

Minnesota State-Mankato was a solid third-place choice with 143 points while Adams State (Colo.) was fourth with 134 and Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.) fifth with 122. Rounding out the top 10 is Upper Iowa, Nebraska-Omaha, Western State (Colo.), Wisconsin-Parkside and Chadron State (Neb.).

UCO has four All-Americans back from last year's team, paced by undefeated national champion Kyle Evans. He enters the season ranked No. 1 at 141 pounds along with teammate Tyler Zukerman at 125.

UNK has seven national placers returning, with defending champion and top-rated Tervel Dlagnev (285) leading the way along with 2006 champion and No. 1-ranked Brett Allgood (133).

Chadron State also has two top-ranked individuals in Brett Hunter (165) and Josh Majerus (197).

The 2008 NCAA Division II Wrestling Championships will be hosted by Upper Iowa on March 14-15 in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

EDMOND, Okla. -- Nebraska-Kearney took over as the No. 1 team in NCAA Division II wrestling, with the Lopers the near-unanimous pick in the first regular-season poll released by the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association Thursday.

UNK, last year's national runner-up, shared the No. 1 spot with defending champion Central Oklahoma in the preseason poll before taking the top spot by itself. The Lopers earned seven of the eight first-place votes cast in balloting of coaches from around the country and finished with 158 points.

Minnesota State-Mankato moved up from third to second with 152 points, while the Bronchos dropped to third with 140. Adams State (Colo.) and Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.) stayed fourth and fifth, respectively, and rounding out the top 10 was Upper Iowa, Nebraska-Omaha, Western State (Colo.), Newberry (S.C.) and Ashland (Ohio).

The 2008 NCAA Division II Wrestling Championships will be hosted by Upper Iowa on March 14-15 in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

EDMOND, Okla. -- Nebraska-Kearney maintained its position atop the NCAA Division II wrestling rankings and will be the favorite to defend its title at the NWCA Division II National Duals this weekend, according to the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association poll that was released Wednesday.

UNK, last year's national runner-up, earned six of the eight first-place votes cast in balloting of coaches from around the country and finished with 158 points. Nebraska-Omaha picked up the other two first-place votes and jumped from seventh to second in the poll with 150 pounds.

Defending national champion Central Oklahoma was third with 141 points, followed by Minnesota State-Mankato (139) and Adams State (128). Rounding out the top 10 was Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.), Upper Iowa, Ashland (Ohio), Western State (Colo.) and Newberry (S.C.).

The NWCA Division II National Duals will be held Saturday and Sunday at the UNI-Dome in Cedar Falls, Iowa, with 13 top-20 teams -- including eight in the top-10 -- competing in that 16-team event. UNK is the No. 1 seed, with UNO second, UCO third and MSU-Mankato fourth.

EDMOND, Okla. -- A championship effort at the Cliff Keen/NWCA Division II National duals has earned Minnesota State-Mankato its first-ever No. 1 ranking in the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association poll that was released Wednesday.

The Mavericks won the 16-team national dual tournament on Jan. 13 in Cedar Falls, Iowa with a thrilling 19-17 finals victory over North Region rival Nebraska-Omaha and were a near-unanimous No. 1 pick after receiving seven of the eight first-place votes cast in finishing with 159 points.

UNO earned the remaining first-place vote and stayed second in the poll with 153 points, while defending national champion Central Oklahoma was third with 153 points and previous No. 1 Nebraska-Kearney fourth with 136.

Rounding out the top 10 was Adams State (Colo.), Western State (Colo.), Minnesota State-Moorhead, Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.), Upper Iowa and Newberry (S.C.). MSU-Moorhead made the biggest leap, moving from 17th to No. 7 after a sixth-place finish at the national dual meet.

MSU-Mankato has seven of its 10 individuals in the rankings, topped by No. 1 Jason Rhoten at 157 pounds. UNO also has seven ranked wrestlers, with 125 Cody Garcia and 149 Todd Meneely both No. 1.

The NCAA Division II Wrestling Championships will be held March 14-15 in Cedar Rapids, Iowa and hosted by Upper Iowa.

EDMOND, Okla. -- Unbeaten Minnesota State-Mankato maintained its perch atop the NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association poll that was released Thursday.

The Mavericks, 16-0-1 in duals, reached No. 1 for the first time in the NCAA Division II rankings two weeks ago and stayed there by a slim two-point margin over Nebraska-Omaha, with those two teams set to square off Saturday night in Omaha.

MSU-Mankato received five of the eight first-place votes cast in finishing with 157 points, while UNO had the remaining three first-place votes and 155 points.

Adams State (Colo.) rode dual wins over defending national champion Central Oklahoma and Western State (Colo.) to move to No. 3 in the poll with 136 points, one ahead of Nebraska-Kearney. Rounding out the top 10 was Western State, UCO, Newberry (S.C.), Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.), Upper Iowa and Ashland (Ohio).

MSU-Mankato has seven of its 10 individuals in the rankings, topped by No. 1 Jason Rhoten at 157 pounds. UNO also has seven ranked wrestlers, with 125 Cody Garcia and 149 Todd Meneely both No. 1.

The NCAA Division II Wrestling Championships will be held March 14-15 in Cedar Rapids, Iowa and hosted by Upper Iowa.

EDMOND, Okla. -- Nebraska-Omaha took over the No. 1 ranking in the final regular-season NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association rankings that were released Wednesday.

The Mavericks, who had a three-year string of national championships ended by Central Oklahoma last year, switched places with previous No. 1 Minnesota State-Mankato after a 32-7 dual win over MSU-Mankato on Feb. 8.

UNO received seven of the eight first-place votes cast in balloting of coaches from around the country in finishing with 159 points, while MSU-Mankato was second with 152.

Adams State (Colo.) stayed third with 145 points, Western State (Colo.) moved to fourth with 135 and Nebraska-Kearney dropped to fifth with 125. Rounding out the top 10 was UCO, Newberry (S.C.), Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.), Ashland (Ohio) and St. Cloud State (Minn.).

Regional qualifying tournaments will be held the weekend of March 1-2, with Pittsburgh-Johnstown hosting the East, MSU-Mankato the North, Indianapolis the Midwest and New Mexico Highlands the West.

The top-four placers at each weight class from all four regionals advance to the NCAA Division II Wrestling Championships, set for March 14-15 in Cedar Rapids, Iowa with Upper Iowa as the host.

EDMOND, Okla. -- Minnesota State-Mankato regained the No. 1 ranking in the final NCAA Division II Wrestling Coaches' Association poll that was released Tuesday and will take the favorite's role into next week's national tournament.

The Mavericks earned their first-ever Division II No. 1 ranking in the Feb. 6 poll only to lose it two weeks later after a dual loss to Nebraska-Omaha, but MSU-Mankato jumped back on top after winning its second straight North Region title over UNO.
