The 2008-2009 Division II All-Academic Wrestling Team consists of 127 student-athletes from 30 universities and colleges. Thirty-two members were named to the first team, 33 to the second team and 62 were named as honorable mentions. The University of Nebraska at Omaha placed seven members on the first or second teams. The University of Wisconsin-Parkside and the University of Nebraska at Kearney placed five members and Gannon University, the University of Findlay and the University of Indianapolis each placed four members. Three student athletes were named to the team for the fourth time. They were Paul Sutton and Keenan McCurdy from the University of Nebraska at Kearney and Tony Gehling from Upper Iowa. Fifteen athletes were named to the team for the third time. They include Travis Clark, Justin Shannon and Andrejs Zaliskalns from the University of Findlay; Jeremiah Hill and Brian Pogel from Mercyhurst College; Jacob Tazzi and Kevin McElhaney from Gannon University; Dean Schulty and Bryan Isabell from Truman State University; Jeffery Schossow from Adam State College; Ryan Etherton from the University of Nebraska at Kearney; Danny Grater from Fort Hays State University; Cody Garcia from the University of Nebraska at Omaha; Josh Majerus from Chadron State College; and Matt Jackson from St. Cloud State University. Three students,, Dustin Nagel, a Finance major from MSU-Moorhead, James Brett, a Business Marketing major from Carson-Newman College and Cody Weitzel, a Mechanical Engineering student from Colorado School of Mines have perfect 4.0 GPA's.

In order for a student-athlete to be nominated for the Division II All-Academic Team, he needed to have a minimum 3.00 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale. He must also be in at least his second full year at his school, be a varsity member on his team or a key reserve, demonstrate a degree of skill and have a minimum of two letters of recommendation (academic advisor and coach) submitted on his behalf.

Truman State University recorded the highest team grade point average (GPA) in the sixteenth annual Division II All-Academic Wrestling Team selection and won the Academic National Championship. Truman State University has now won the Academic National Championship a total of five times. Previous championships were won in 1996-97, 2001-02, 2006-07 and 2007-08. Only Colorado School of Mines has won as many with five. Truman State is the first school to win the championship in three consecutive years. Six other NCAA II schools have also won the National Championships. They include the University of Wisconsin-Parkside, Fort Hays State University, West Liberty State College, Minnesota State University-Mankato, the University of Nebraska at Omaha and the University of Nebraska at Kearney. In 2005 the University of Nebraska at Omaha hosted the NCAA II National Championships and won both the wrestling and the academic national titles. They are the only school to accomplish that feat. The Team GPA is calculated by averaging the cumulative grade point averages of ten wrestlers from each team of which eight of those wrestlers must have competed in their team's NCAA II National Qualifying tournament.
