The 2009-2010 Division II All-Academic Wrestling Team consists of 133 student-athletes from 32 universities and colleges. Thirty-six members were named to the first team, 33 members to the second team, and 64 were named as honorable mention. The University of Wisconsin-Parkside placed five wrestlers on the first team, the University of Nebraska-Omaha placed four members, The University of Pittsburgh Johnstown, Gannon University and Augustana College each placed three. The University of Central Missouri placed five wrestlers on the second team and the University of Nebraska-Omaha placed four. Truman University, the University of Nebraska at Kearney and St. Cloud State University each placed seven wrestlers on the honorable mention list. Seven student-athletes were named to the team for the fourth time. They were Danny Grater and Shawn Kuhlman both from Fort Hays State University; Dean Schultz III and Bryan Isabell both from Truman State University; Cody Garcia from the University of Nebraska-Omaha; Justin Shannon from the University of Findlay; and Kevin McElhaney from Gannon University. Thirteen student-athletes were named to the team for the third time. They include Lucas Haag and Cody Zimmerman from the University of Wisconsin-Parkside; Josh Shields and Andy Lamancusa from Mercyhurst College; Kyle Francis from Western State College; Jeff Havelka from the University of Findlay; Jared Little from Northern State University; Jacob Marrs from the University of Nebraska-Omaha; Lynn Panko from the University of Indianapolis; Jay Sherer from Augustana College; John Sundgen from St Cloud State University; Brandon Neifeld from West Liberty State College; and Evan Forde from Minnesota State University-Moorhead. One student, Mitchell Schultz, a Business Administration major from Upper Iowa University has a perfect 4.0 GPA.

In order for a student-athlete to be nominated for the Division II All-Academic Team, he needed to have a minimum 3.00 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale. He must also be in at least his second full year at his school, be a varsity member on his team or a key reserve, demonstrate a degree of skill and have a minimum of two letters of recommendation (academic advisor and coach) submitted on his behalf.

Truman State University recorded the highest team grade point average (GPA) in the Seventeenth Annual Division II All-Academic Wrestling Team selection and has won the Academic National Championship. Truman State University has now won the Academic National Championship a total of six times. Previous championships were won in 1997, 2002, 2007, 2008 and 2009. Truman State is the first school to win the championship in four consecutive years. Seven other NCAA II schools have also won the National Championship. They include the University of Wisconsin-Parkside, Fort Hays State university, Colorado School of Mines, West Liberty State College, Minnesota State University-Mankato, the University of Nebraska at Omaha and the University of Nebraska at Kearney. In 2005 the University of Nebraska at Omaha hosted the NCAA II National Championships and won both the wrestling and the academic national titles. They are the only school to accomplish that feat. The Team GPA is calculated by averaging the cumulative grade point averages of ten wrestlers from each team of which eight of those wrestlers must have competed in their team's NCAA II National Qualifying tournament.
