The Huskies, coming off a best-ever runner-up finish in last year's national tournament, received four of the eight first-place votes cast in balloting of coaches from around the country and finished with 153 points in earning the favorite's tag.

Newberry (S.C.), which has won four straight Super Region I titles and was sixth nationally last season, earned three first-place votes and is second in the poll with 150 points. Upper Iowa came in third with 144 points, Nebraska-Kearney had the other first-place vote in finishing fourth with 132 and Grand Canyon (Ariz.) is fifth with 130.

Rounding out the top 10 is Augustana (S.D.), Central Oklahoma, Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.), Wisconsin-Parkside and Ashland (Ohio).

Twenty-nine teams received points in the wide-open voting, with first-year program Maryville (Mo.) coming in 15th with 47 points. Nebraska-Omaha had its program disbanded last year after winning its third straight national championship and several members of that team, led by long-time head coach Mike Denney, went to Maryville.

EDMOND, Okla. -- St. Cloud State (Minn.) will take the favorite's role into next week's NCAA Division II Wrestling Championships after the Huskies earned every first-place vote in the final poll released Wednesday by the Division II Wrestling Coaches Association.

SCSU received all eight first-place votes in balloting of coaches from around the country to finish with 160 points and top the rankings for the sixth time in seven polls this season. The Huskies followed up a school-record 20-0 dual season by capturing their second straight Super Regional Three title last week, qualifying seven individuals for the national tournament.

The 2012 NCAA Division II Wrestling Championships will be held in Pueblo, Colo. March 9-10, with Colorado State-Pueblo serving as the host institution.

Super Regional One champion Newberry remained No. 2 with 148 points, with Super Regional Four winner Nebraska-Kearney four points behind in third. Upper Iowa had 129 points to stay fourth, while Super Regional Two champion Central Oklahoma moved past Augustana (S.D.) by one point for the fifth spot.

Making up the rest of the top 10 is Grand Canyon (Ariz.), Adams State (Colo.), Pittsburgh-Johnstown (Pa.) and Wisconsin-Parkside. Three new teams entered in the top 20, with Ouachita Baptist (Ark.) making its first-ever appearance at No. 19.
